



The 2020 Corinthian Friday Night Races

Sailing Instructions (including amendment 1&2)

April 10 to August 28, 2020

Organizing Authority: Corinthian Yacht Club

1. RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 RRS 40 is replaced with: "Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing clothing or personal equipment. Wetsuits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices"

2 ENTRIES

- 2.1 All boats must display on their mainsail the sail number shown on their entry form or gain Race Committee (RC) approval for a change by 1730 hours the day of the race.
- 2.2 All sailboats not entered in a One-Design fleet shall have valid 2020 NC - PHRF rating certificate.
- 2.3 Only one entry per boat will be accepted.
- 2.4 All boats must check in before starting by hailing the race committee by stating Boat Name, Sail number and "We confirm SPP Compliance" on VHF 72. Check in will be available from 17:45 hrs to 18:10 hrs. A boat not confirming SPP compliance and has not received acknowledgement by the race committee will be scored DNC.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the CYC website at race.cyc.org/fnr.
- 3.2 Any change to these Sailing Instructions will be posted by 1030 hours on the day of the race and shall be signaled by hoisting the flag L on the Clubhouse flagpole. The CYC website may have copies of such documents.
- 3.3 All references to the CYC Notice Board in the Sailing Instructions shall be deemed to read the CYC Website race.cyc.org/fnr

4. SIGNALS

- 4.1. Signals will be displayed from the flagpole located SE corner of the Club deck. Race Committee may broadcast information about the race on VHF 72.
- 4.2. The race committee may signal AP over A by posting a notice on the Notice Board and publication on the CYC website. No audible signal or display of flags will be made. This changes RRS 27.3
- 4.3. The race committee does not intend to make audible signals as boats finish but may make a visible acknowledgement of boats crossing the finish line.

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Races will be held each Friday evening from April 10 to August 28, 2020. The warning signal for the first race each day will be approximately 1815 hours.

6. **CLASSES AND DIVISIONS:** (as described in Addendum A).
 - 6.1. Divisions and division assignment shall be at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
 - 6.2. Divisions are subject to change by amendment or by notice to boats affected.
 - 6.3. Prior to participating in a race, a Skipper may submit a request for their boat to be reassigned divisions to the Race Committee(RC), which may be granted at the discretion of the RC. Once a boat has started a race in the series, division reassignment at the request of the Skipper, will not be permitted.
 - 6.4. Divisions will be reviewed at the conclusion of the Spring Series and before the Summer series commences. At this time a Skipper may request a division change.
7. **RACING AREA, COURSES, MARKS AND RESTRICTED AREAS:** (courses and marks described in Addendum B)
 - 7.1. The racing area will be San Francisco Bay. All marks between the Start and the Finish are rounding marks. Numeral placards displayed on the Race Deck will indicate courses.
 - 7.2. For safety, each of the lines below is an obstruction, and boats are prohibited from sailing across any of these lines:
 - (a) A line between Anita Rock and its buoy "AR" (located NW of Anita Rock).
 - (b) Each of the lines bounded by the points below and the closest points ashore
 - (i) Anita Rock
 - (ii) Buoy "AR" (located NW of Anita Rock).
 - (iii) The "H" Beam (located approximately 200 yards W of StFYC).
 - (iv) The Bell Buoy off the W end of Alcatraz Island.
 - (v) The buoy S of Point Blunt on Angel Island
8. **STARTING LINE**

The starting line will be between an orange placard on the CYC Race Deck and a temporary buoy.
9. **FINISHING LINE**

The finishing line will be between an orange placard on the CYC Race Deck and a temporary buoy.
10. **TIME LIMIT**
 - 10.1. The time limit for each race will be 15 minutes after sunset for San Francisco, as published by NOAA.
 - 10.2. Boats failing to finish before the time limit expires and after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.
11. **PROTESTS**
 - 11.1. Protests shall be delivered to CYC Club Office on the day of the race. The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished and a list of protests received will be posted on the notice board.
 - 11.2. Protest hearings may be held by a video or other conference forum at a time agreed to by the protest participants.

12. SCORING:

- 12.1. Races will be scored time-on-time under PHRF and one design Class Rules with each series being scored separately under the low point scoring system.
- 12.2. Boats scored DNF, RET, DNS, DSQ or OCS will receive one more point than the number of starters in that race, and boats scored DNC will receive two more points than the number of starters in that race. This changes RRS A9.

13. SERIES:

- 13.1. There will be two race Series in the CYC Friday Night race regatta. The Spring series includes races from April 10 to June 12 and the Summer Series includes races from June 19 to August 21.
- 13.2. Each series will be scored separately. In each Series, there will be one throwout if fewer than seven races are sailed and two throwouts if seven or more are sailed.
- 13.3. The race on August 28 will not be scored as part of either series.
- 13.4. A minimum of three races will constitute a series.
- 13.5. The race on June 26 will not be scored as part of the Summer Series.

14. RETIRING BEFORE FINISH

A boat that retires prior to finishing shall notify the race committee on VHF 72 or by phone as soon as reasonably possible.

15. TROPHIES:

Daily and series trophies will be awarded. A boat representative must collect their Daily trophy prior to or when Series trophies are available. Spring series trophies will be awarded following the race on June 12 and summer series trophies will be awarded following the race on August 28.

16. INTERFERENCE WITH OTHER VESSELS

- 16.1. Boats shall not impede the passage of a vessel that can safely navigate only within a narrow channel, fairway or large-vessel traffic lane. Boats so doing shall be subject to protest and disqualification upon notice from any competitor, the RC, a government agency, or the operator of the vessel.
- 16.2. A boat that receives five or more horn blasts from a commercial or government vessel shall be presumed to have impeded such passage. The time for protest will be extended in such cases. This changes RRS 61.3.

17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
